Every time you use a bank ATM, charge your credit card, or purchase something online, your information is obtained and sometimes stored in databases.

So what can you do to protect your privacy? Here are some tips to avoid leaving traceable footprints around:

- Do not give out your social security number
- Say "No, thank you!" to telemarketers or don't even answer numbers you do not recognize
- Avoid entering sweepstakes

+ WHAT CAN YOU DO TO PROTECT YOURSELF

Most people have heard of the term 'catburglar' but do you actually know what one is? People are referred to as cat burglars if they enter your building by climbing to an upper story.

Tricky--and scary--so how can you make sure you have the upper hand?

- Arm your security system: Whether you leave the home for 5 minutes or 5 days, you should arm your system.
- Lock up: Burglars look for easy access points, so don't give them any. All windows, entry doors, and storm doors should be locked up tight when you are away.
- Remove easy access points: Risk-free entrance points are gold to burglars, so remove them. Make sure entry points are well-lit with motion sensor lights.

Remember, your security system is the best defense against any would-be burglars!





HOW YOUR MOOD AFFECTS YOUR VULNERABILITY

Your bad mood can instantaneously put you in a compromised situation when you are not paying attention. In fact, did you know that most often muggers select victims who seem preoccupied, distracted, or not alert of their surroundings. Additional studies have shown that people who are angry or depressed are more vulnerable.

Why is this? How does your bad mood influence the way you think or react in a situation? People who are in a bad mood are:

- More likely to take chances--like cutting through a bad area
- Less alert about their surroundings
- More likely to skip regular security measures
- More likely to appear vulnerable while walking
- More likely to provoke others
- More likely to drink in excess

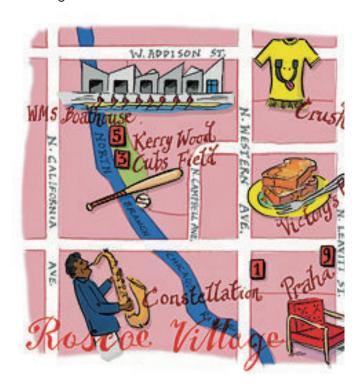

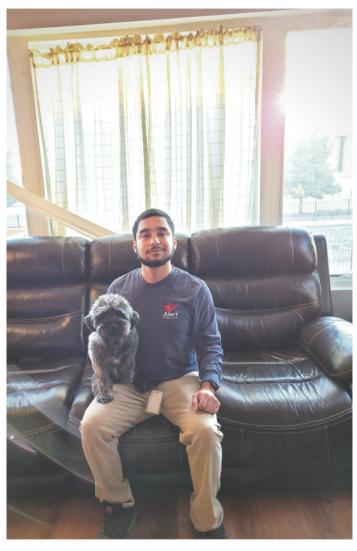
ONE OF THE SAFEST AREAS OF CHICAGO
